

## Applying What You've Learned Module II Search PEN Using the Table of Contents

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**NOTE: To complete these activities you need a subscription to PEN.** Go to the PEN home page by typing the PEN URL into your web browser [www.dieteticsatwork.com/pen/home.asp](http://www.dieteticsatwork.com/pen/home.asp)

- Enter your User ID and Password that you've been assigned and click on "login"
- Hover your mouse over the "Knowledge Pathway" button on the top navigation bar and click on "Table of Contents" in the drop-down menu.
- Select any knowledge pathway of interest to you by clicking on the title.
- Once in the knowledge pathway, expand the list of questions by clicking on "all practice questions" from the left-hand navigation bar.
- For any practice question of your choice, click on the link to "View Key Practice Points".
- Notice the grade of evidence for each practice point – click on one of the evidence grades (in brackets A,B,C or D immediately following the Key Practice Point) to review what the evidence grade means. In some cases you may find an evidence grade is a combination of A&B, B&C, A&C. Close the evidence grading protocol description by clicking on the red X in the top right hand corner.
- Drill down to review the evidence for any key practice point by clicking on the "Evidence" link just below the Key Practice Point.
- Review the list of references used to develop the Key Practice Point and click on the link to view the reference article in more detail.
- Review an Evidence Summary, Practice Guidance Summary and Background – you'll find these links on the left-hand navigation bar.
- Find out who the authors and reviewers for the pathway are by clicking on "Pathway Contributors" in the left-hand navigation bar.
- Review the Tools and Resources in the pathway by clicking on the link in the left hand navigation bar.

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- Select a resource and email it to yourself by filling in your own email in the field for your client's name. Then click on "Send." Check your email inbox to retrieve the resource.
- Great job! You've now finished your practical assignment for Module II and are now ready to learn some faster search strategies in Module III.
